The Lenten Journey is almost over. I hope you've had a meaningful time of prayer, fasting, and giving. I pray that you've grown in the promises given to you in your baptism, especially those of being declared a child of God and of dying and rising with Christ each day as you are forgiven and loved.

On Maundy Thursday, we gather for worship and the Last Supper, a night when Jesus gathered with family and friends for one final meal. This was an emotion time as he prepared for betrayal, arrest, and execution. As a faith community, we remember his demonstration of love, as he washed his disciples' feet. We see Jesus' love for us that is passed down through the saints to now when he passed bread and wine around the table, declaring, "This is my body; this is my blood, given and shed for you." In the midst of experiencing his love for us, we are reminded of his commandment that we, too, are called to live lives overflowing with love for others.

Continuing the worship service on Good Friday, we gather to remember Jesus' time of suffering and death on the cross. Even in the midst of his immense suffering that is likely beyond what we can imagine, we remember how Jesus reached out with love to his family and friends and with forgiveness to those who nailed him to that cross. As we hear the words from the cross, we, too, experience love and forgiveness which knows no end and changes our lives.

And on Easter morning, we participate in the celebration which has transformed the lives of millions of people for almost 2000 years. This is the good news that impacts every aspect of our lives: death does not have the last word, instead the promise of forgiveness, love, and eternal life through Jesus Christ are meant for us and for our sisters and brothers around the world. This is a time to celebrate! With people around the world and the saints who have gone before us and will come after us, we get to proclaim that "Christ is Risen! Alleluia!"

It is my hope that you will join us for this journey, as we remember the gift of Christ's unending love and forgiveness.

"The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein." Psalm 24:1

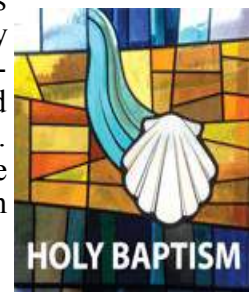
God says it is mine.

Summer Day Camp is Coming!



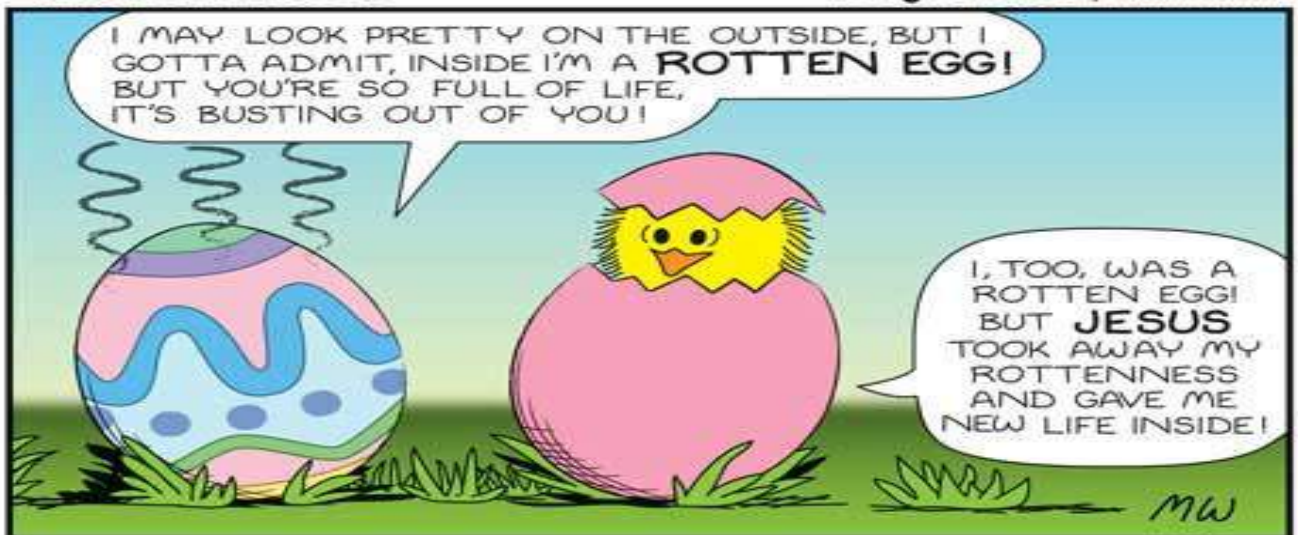

Our camp is held in conjunction with Lutheran Outdoor Ministries in Ohio (LOMO) and provides the perfect opportunity for children entering grades 1-7 to enjoy a fun-filled, jam-packed, high-energy, God-loving, week-long experience! We have openings for 30 children, registration is on a first come-first serve basis, and forms are available in the narthex. The fee for the camp is \$50 for the first family member, with a sliding scale for each additional child. If needed, scholarships are available to help defray the cost of the camp. Please help spread the word and invite your friends, family, and neighbors to camp! We have been presented with a great opportunity to partner with St. John's and will now provide a "Mini" Day Camp experience for pre-schoolers from our congregations.

Details are being finalized, but Preschooler Day Camp will run on Mon, Wed, & Fri from 10:00 am - 12:00 pm. This opportunity is open to 3-5-year olds, and they must be potty-trained. There is very limited space for this expanded age group and is only being offered to the congregations of Zion and St. John's. The cost for this "Mini" Camp is \$10.00. Book Club with Sandusky Lutheran congregations

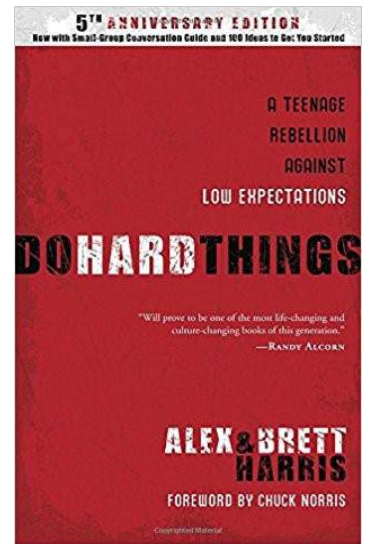
What if...Wow that could be followed by so many things especially in today's world, including what if we challenged our teens to DO HARD THINGS!

ST. JOHN'S LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

March 7, 2017

CALL TO ORDER: President Bob Krawetzki called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

PRAYER: Pastor Stacy handed out Luther's Small Catechism and had us read The Sacrament of the Altar. This is to remind us that as we do the work of the church, Jesus is always with us and we are reminded of this by the words: "Do this for the remembrance of me".

MEMBERS PRESENT: Bob Krawetzki, Ann Voight, Peg Kingsley, Jacob Deehr, Paula Hoffman, Bonny Ambos, Pastor Stacy, Jim Moore, Jerrie Krawetzki, Colleen Shupe

EXCUSED: Ray Witt, Kevin Young, Barry Laird.

MINUTES: February 7, 2017 council meeting minutes were approved as written by council on motion by Jerrie Krawetzki and seconded by Jim Moore.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's Report: January financials presented by Colleen Shupe. Year- to-date results are:

YTD Revenue --- \$14, 911
YTD Expenses --- \$13, 825
Net Revenue --- \$1086

Motion by Jim Moore and seconded by Paula Hoffman to accept the Treasurer's Report. Motion passed.

Pastor Stacy: Pastor submitted her written report a week ago. She is encouraging everyone in the congregation to attend Family Camp being held in Mansfield from June 30th-July 2nd. She is starting a prayer chain and will be talking with people interested after worship services this coming Sunday. She is taking vacation time on April 19th and 20th, and May 24th and 25th.

Deacons: Bonny Ambos reported everything is running smoothly at this time.

FLAME: Written report submitted - In Barry's absence, Bob reported that FLAME is continuing work on Life Tree. FLAME will be handling the entire cost of sponsoring the Firelands Symphony Orchestra Opening Night which is part of the 500th Anniversary Observance of the Reformation. Allison Young is our representative for Joy Time.

Trustees: Written report submitted. Jake reported that the elevator was checked out and the computer was rebooted. It is now fully functional. The furnace in the upper room is now fixed and the Property Team recommends that we purchase a maintenance agreement with Abtec. This will reduce the cost of future repairs. He also said that the alarm system has been installed in the parsonage and is working.

Jake reminded us that several years ago Council decided we will maintain the existing cemetery and not make any expansions to the property. That was never officially voted on as a policy. Jake moved and Ann Voight seconded that we make this our policy at this time. Motion passed.

Faith/Life Team: Written report submitted. Paula reported that the team discussed purchasing children's Bible's for our 4th graders.

Finance Team: Written report submitted. The team has recommended accepting several items which are listed under New Business.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Bob reported that St. Paul's, Sandusky Zion and St. John's have been working together on **coordinating youth activities**. Pastor Stacy and Allison Young attend these meetings. Pastor Stacy shared that Zion Huron will soon be joining the group. At this time we are not participating financially in this project, but are staying engaged and will plug in where we can. They are planning a 2019 Youth Gathering for all Ohio.

- Colleen reported that all **credit cards** have been dispersed.
- As a follow up from our meeting in January, Bob reported that Heather Ruggles, John Miller and Jim Seimon will serve on the **Mutual Ministry Team** for a 1 year term. Paula Hoffman, Peg Kingsley and Kevin Young will serve a 2 year term.
- Jake will call a contractor for **painting the Bell Tower**.

Jim Moore suggested that we establish a yearly date for **evaluating the pastor**. After discussion Ann Voight moved and Paula Hoffman seconded that we use the anniversary of hiring as the date each year for the evaluation. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Jim Moore brought up the need for **clearly defined duties for Ushers**. Pastor Stacy is currently working, in conjunction with the Worship Team, on making lists of guidelines for several volunteer jobs, such as ushers, acolytes, lay readers, etc. Discussion followed about the various things needing attention at each Sunday's service. We will continue this when Pastor has completed the guidelines.
- Bob announced that **Jeanette Walz** allotted, in her trust, \$15,000 to the St. John's Cemetery Fund. When her estate is settled and all outstanding bills are paid, St. John's will receive the balance of Jeanette's estate which is to go entirely to the Endowment Fund. Bob will announce this in church on this coming Sunday. Many thanks and kind words were expressed about Jeanette by Council members. We must do something to honor this tremendous gift when it is received.
- The Finance Team recommended that we accept the newly revised **Wedding and Funeral Guidelines**. Ann Voight moved and Bonny Ambos seconded that the Funeral Guidelines be accepted as written. Motion passed. Paula Hoffman moved and Jim Moore seconded that we accept the Wedding Guidelines as written. Motion passed.
- Council members signed a card that will be sent to our **seminary student**, Dan Gutman, to whom we donated \$500 at our January meeting. We will be hearing more from him as the year goes on.
- The Finance Team recommended that we accept the Property Team's recommendation to enter into a **maintenance agreement with Abtec**. Jim Moore moved and Colleen Shupe seconded the motion to accept. Motion passed.
- The Finance Team recommended that we pay for the installation of **the alarm system at the parsonage** and Pastor Stacy and Ryan will pay for the monthly upkeep. Bonny Ambos moved and Colleen Shupe seconded that we approve this recommendation. Discussion followed. Motion passed.
- **Summer is coming!** We will ask the congregation to again vote on whether to begin church at 9 AM or stay with 10:30 AM. This period would begin the Sunday after Memorial Day and end after Labor Day weekend.
- **ADJOURNMENT:** On motion by Colleen Shupe and seconded by Bonnie Ambos, our meeting was adjourned. We prayed the Lord's Prayer before departing.
