






Reformation 500 Celebration Opportunities

CALL TO ORDER: President Bob Krawetzki called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

PRAYER: Pastor Stacy led us in prayer reminding us that we had all promised to pray for those who have been baptized at St. John's. She asked us to keep this in mind and to ask ourselves how are we helping to keep our promises and make them come true.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Bob Krawetzki, Peg Kingsley, Paula Hoffman, Bonny Ambos, Pastor Stacy, Jim Moore. Jerrie Krawetzki, Ray Witt, Kevin Young, Ann Voight, Colleen Shupe Excused absence: Jake Deehr, Barry Laird,

MINUTES: June 6, 2017 council meeting minutes were approved as written by council on motion by Ray Witt and seconded by Jim Moore.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's Report: YTD Revenue---\$84,387

YTD Expenses---78,166 Net Revenue---\$6845

Treasurer's report was approved as written by council on motion by Ray Witt and seconded by Jim Moore.

Pastor Stacy: Pastor submitted her written report a week ago. She is still looking for Sunday School teachers for the fall. She also submitted a very thorough Maternity Leave List detailing all that Council would need to know about the time from August 27th to October 29th when she will be on maternity leave. Thank you, Pastor Stacy, for your hard work on this preparation!

Deacons: Bonny Ambos reported everything is running smoothly at this time.

Elders: Paula reported that the Faith/Life Team will be working with the Worship Team for September 10th, Rally Day. She is also in preparation for our participation in the Crop Walk event this year.

Trustees: Ray reported that the Property Team had met in June and has prepared a priority list of things needing attention at the church and cemetery. Discussion followed about how to deal with broken grave stones at the cemetery. Our sexton, Kevin Young, will look into this and report back to Council at a future date.

Good News Amen: Written report submitted and reviewed.

Worship Team: Written report submitted and reviewed.

FLAMe: Written report submitted. St. John's will be hosting a corn roast on August 21st and is responsible for the corn and butter. Discussion followed about ways to deal with cooking both the corn and hot dogs. We need RSVP's in order to plan amounts of food needed.

Finance Team: Written report submitted. All team members who submit bills to the treasurer are asked to put their name and their team's name on the bill. The Finance Team recommends that Council consider funding for the storm window project as soon as possible with the goal being to come up with a plan as to when and how to start the window project.

Faith/Life Team: Written report submitted.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Jake continues work on the bell tower.
- Ray presented a very enlightening and thorough overview and estimate of what is needed to repair our storm windows. This report was done in May of 2016 by Reggie Buehrer of Window Creations, LLC. - The elevator is working. Ray had contacted the repairman who was unable to find any reason why it intermittently quits. The organ remains not working and the repairman for it hopefully will be here this week as well.
- Jake will do sidewalk repair sometime this fall.
- Bob reported several of the upcoming events listed in our newsletter and bulletin.
- Jen Parkinson, youth director for St. Paul's and Zion attended our service this past month. Pastor Stacy works with Jen to incorporate our youth with events that Jen does, when it is possible.
- Discussion of the pastor's first year evaluation, currently being worked on by Council members, led to plans for looking at ways to do evaluations in the future.
- Paula reported that LifeTouch will be here on September 26th to take anyone's picture who would like a retake or a first time picture. If we get 15 or more people participating we will get new directories.
- Pastor Stacy would like a small TV and DVD player for the Sunday School. We'll check to see if anyone would want to donate this item before looking at purchasing one.

ADJOURNMENT: On motion by Kevin Young and seconded by Paula Hoffman, our meeting was adjourned. We prayed the Lord's Prayer before departing.

"Therefore my heart is glad, and my glory rejoices; my flesh also will rest in hope. Psalm 16:9.


Brothers in faith called home to the Church Triumphant
