Pentecost Sermon Reflection Jerry Bauer

Pastor Stacy's Pentecost sermon focused on breath and the Holy Spirit.

The Hebrew word "ruach" translates as breath or spirit, thus breath of God or Spirit of God, The sermon stressed being quiet and attentive to our breath and the Holy Spirit.

In yoga the primary emphasis is on the breath, mindful of each inhale and exhale. A saying (mantra) can be repeated while inhaling and exhaling.


Choir Resumes

Your FLAMe Board met on July 17, 2018 at St. John's.

Church Security is something that many take for granted. When are your church doors unlocked? Who has access to those doors? Do you have a plan if someone enters your church who is seeking something other than Christ? Do you know what to do as a parishioner, if someone comes to Sunday services with bad intentions? Do you know what laws are in place that relate to your place of worship? If you answered "I don't know," or "no" to any of these questions - you are not alone. We would like to make certain that you are prepared. We have brought together a group of speakers who will prepare you, educate you, and help you take the necessary steps to make your church the safe haven we all want them to be. FLAMe's second Church Security Seminar will be held September 25th at St. Paul's at 7pm. Sheriff Sigworth is organizing this seminar with two other county sheriffs. This program will consist of training in how to survive an active shooter situation. And then, we will have a panel discussion with the presenters to discuss their thoughts on self -defense, self-preservation, and how Faith and the law interact with these topics. Be sure someone from your congregation attends.

Lifetree Café meets the second Monday of each summer month. The meetings are hosted at the Christian Center behind Zion, Huron. The meetings consist of a short film and discussion of our thoughts, questions, and ideas. The topic for August is "Can God Love a Mess Like Me?"
