Dear St. John's family,

It has already been a busy fall! It's such a joy to see the exciting work of the Spirit in and through each of you. In the midst of the busy times, I hope you are finding time to talk with your family (whatever family looks like for you).

This past month, I spent additional time learning about intergenerational ministry, or ministry where all ages worship, play, learn, serve, and fellowship together. One idea that Dr. Rich Melheim has taught is that of Faith 5, which are daily faith acts in the home—and there are five of them. If you haven't yet experienced Faith 5 (or if you've been doing it for a while), this is a great opportunity to sit down with family or friends and have an easy conversation about faith as we grow together as disciples. Would you give Faith 5 a try with your family this month? The steps are listed below to get you started, but if you have any questions, please let me know!

FAITH5

1. **SHARE** highs and lows from this day (*what was good, what was difficult today?*)
2. **READ** Luke 9:28-36— (*or any scripture passage, you can choose a different one each day*)

²⁸Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³⁰Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. ³¹They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³²Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" —not knowing what he said. ³⁴While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. ³⁵Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" ³⁶When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found

alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

3. **TALK** about how that story or verse might relate to the highs and lows *(or ask another question that will get your family talking)*
 - a. Have you ever had a mountaintop experience? What was it like?
 - b. What was it like leaving that mountaintop experience? Did life go back to normal? Were you changed?
4. **PRAY** for one another's highs and lows, for the congregation, the community, the world.
5. **BLESS** one another "God loves you in life's ups and downs." *(or "you are a beloved child of God" or create your own).*

I hope and pray that your family is able to grow closer to each other and to the Lord who loves us.

ST. JOHN'S LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING
October 2, 2018

CALL TO ORDER: President Bob Krawetzki called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

PRAYER: In Pastor Stacy's absence Ann Voight led us in an opening prayer.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Bob Krawetzki, Ann Voight, Peg Kingsley, Kevin Young, Barry Laird, Paula Hoffman, Jerrie Krawetzki,

MINUTES: September Council minutes and minutes from special Council meetings held on September 16, and 30, 2018 were approved as written by Council on motion by Paula Hoffman and seconded by Barry Laird. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's Report: As of August 31st, 2018: Offerings YTD: \$88,801
Expenses YTD: \$112,622
Net YTD: -\$23,821

Peg Kingsley moved and Barry Laird seconded that we accept the treasurer's report as given. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Pastor Stacy: Written report submitted. We expressed our good wishes for Pastor Stacy's vacation time that she is currently taking.

Deacons: Nothing new to report.

Elders: Nothing new to report.

Trustees: Jake Deehr had sent in a message by email to Council members that he has looked into prices for switching from the current Direct TV satellite to using Buckeye Express. The current contract with Direct TV is ending and Buckeye has now brought service to Scheid Road. Council requests that this issue go to the Property Team for their decision.

Good News Amen: Barry reported that a meeting will be scheduled for late in October or early November.

Worship Team: Written report submitted.

FLAME: Bob reported that FLAME has donated \$100 toward Pastor John Mahwirter's favorite charity. Life Tree continues at Zion Huron. FLAME will be holding a seminar in January/February on opiate use. OHgo has been invited to FLAME to explain their program with the goal being possibly to volunteer help and/or funding. Pastor Ann from Norwalk St. Peter's will be the advisor for FLAME in 2019.

Endowment Committee: The final copy of the Resolution Establishing the St John's Evangelical Lutheran Church of Union Corners Endowment Fund, approved by the congregation on September 30, 2018 was made available to all Council members. The Executive Secretary was also given a copy.

Finance Team: Written report submitted.

Faith/Life Team: Written report submitted Paula reported there will be a baptism on Oct. 14th. Trunk or Treat will be held in the parking lot again this year for Halloween on October 21st from 3-5 PM. Jolene Dillender is joining the Faith/Life team.

OLD BUSINESS:

"Create a Safety Plan for your Church" was held in Perrysburg, OH on September 22nd from 10-2 PM. Allison Young went as the representative of St. John's. Kevin Young read a report that Allison submitted to Bob Krawetzki following her meeting. She is willing to help set up a team to begin working on formulating our Safety Plan. Bob and Sandy Thompson have agreed to work on the team with Allison and will ask the congregation for anyone else wanting to

help. The suggested number of team members is 2-4. Thank you to Allison for giving her time for this preliminary meeting in Perrysburg, and for her written report.

At Jeanette Walz's tribute on October 14th we will use actual glass wine glasses for communion because Jeanette bought the glasses for our congregation many years ago. Pastor Stacy will be giving a prayer of thanks to Jeanette during our church service. Fellowship will follow the church service with memories of Jeanette from the congregation. The October-December team will take care of the food and set-up, with Jeanette's famous 7 Layer cookies, baked by Judy Miller, being one of the food offerings.

Ray has given a down payment to the painter who will be doing the exterior of the church. He is slated to begin work very soon. The Finance Team recommended that Council approve spending \$200 for parsonage gutter covers, \$1537 for sidewalk repair and \$1000 for repairing or replacing the back entrance door. Ann Voight moved and Paula Hoffman seconded that we accept this recommendation. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Sunday School people have begun to have their background check processed. This can be done online.

The Finance Team recommended that the Scholarship guidelines include that the amount of the gifts given to recipients each year shall be less than the IRS non-employee miscellaneous compensation limit, which currently is \$600. Also the recipients of the gift must provide proof of spending it on school related items before receiving the actual money. Council approved those recommendations and added the gifts can be given to any member of St. John's regardless of where they were confirmed. The recipients would be announced in August. Council would like to see an updated application form and will discuss this at a future meeting before April 15, 2019.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ann Voight reported that during Pastor Stacy's ministerial review in 2017, it was suggested that Council begin working on re-aligning the Council positions so that they are more compatible with the actual teams doing the work of the church. This is the model that Pastor Stacy worked with in Toledo. With that goal in mind, St. John's Executive Committee and Nominating Committee consisting of Ann Voight, Lori Stacy and Jeff Justi have proposed the following Council positions for 2019. Council voted to accept these position changes and recommend them to the congregation at the 2018 Annual Congregational meeting in January, 2019.

Permanent Council: Pastor and Immediate Past-President (Ex-officio for one year term)

Executive Council:

- President
- Vice-President
- Secretary
- Treasurer

**Faith Life Team Representative, Worship Team Representative, Financial Team Representative
Property Team Representative, Youth Representative, Two (2) At-Large representatives**

These positions would be in place for one year (2019) to see how effectively this format works. Suggestions would be ongoing through the year with the goal being to make this arrangement permanent by amending our Constitution in 2020.

The Nominating Committee is working on getting a slate of officers by the December Council meeting to fill these positions. Council members thanked Ann and her committee for the thorough work and preparation on this proposal.

Kevin Young moved and Ann Voight seconded that we authorize Jim Moore to purchase an additional lavalier microphone and recorder for use during church services. The Finance Team recommended that Council approve this purchase with a spending limit of \$350. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote. Barry Laird expressed interest in helping with recording of worship and will speak to Jim Moore for guidance.

Ann Voight moved and Barry Laird seconded that the meeting be adjourned. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The next meeting will be November 6, 2018 at 7 PM.
