

When I was around eight years old, everyone seemed to have the speed-adjustable Christmas lights. Some strands would blink, some would change as they went down the row, some would flash, some would stay solidly lit. And it was all remote controlled.

We got the bright idea to drive around town and change everyone's Christmas lights, hopefully without them knowing how it was happening. The solid ones suddenly rapidly flashed. The blinking ones became solid. And we laughed and laughed.

This became a tradition, and each year after worship on Christmas Eve we changed the light displays around town with our remote. It was family time together, all of us in one car sharing stories and laughter, and even praying for the families as we changed their Christmas lights.

Some traditions are like this—they happen randomly, when someone gets an idea to try something new. Some traditions span generations in a family, like dinner together and then worship on Christmas Eve. Sometimes we even start a new tradition, hoping that it will grow and we will be blessed with time together.

This month, during the season on Advent, I encourage you to share your traditions with your family. What did you do as you were growing up? What do you do now? Why? What is the meaning behind it?

As you share your stories and traditions, St. John's would like to offer a new option to our church family. We have decks of cards with devotions on them—one for each day during Advent and Christmas. Please feel free to take a deck of cards and together as a family, as an individual, or as a group (perhaps going to a nursing home in our area and sharing with some new friends) do these daily devotions. Some days are fun as they tell about John the Baptist and his weird diet of insects and honey and then dare you to try a new food. Other days are more serious, as you get to talk about what concerns you have, sharing them with each other and with our Lord.

Whatever your traditions are, I pray that they draw you closer to each other and to our Lord.


Coming in January Book Study Giving Tree

Poem for Advent


A voice cries: In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God." Isaiah 40:3


In the wilderness of daily life uncertainty and fear hover near. In the wilderness hear a voice. sound of God's word, hopeful voice.

Healthy Habits

This month with all the holiday feasting, heartburn can happen. What is heartburn? Your stomach produces acid to aid with digesting the food you eat. The acid normally stays in the stomach. Every now and then a small amount of the acid may get into the tube (esophagus) that connects your stomach and mouth. When the acid goes up into the esophagus you may feel a burning sensation, which is called heartburn. It has nothing to do with the heart. You can keep heartburn at a minimum by eating smaller meals, avoid caffeinated drinks, acidy foods such as tomatoes, as well as less fatty and spicy foods. Smoking and alcohol can also trigger heartburn. It can be difficult to tell the difference between chest pain and heartburn, so see your healthcare provider or emergency room if unsure. CALL TO ORDER: Vice-President, Ann Voight, called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. The meeting was held at Ann's house because there was no electricity at the parsonage or church due to heavy winds.

MINUTES: October Council minutes were approved as written on motion by Jerrie Krawetzki and seconded by Paula Hoffman. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Finance Team recommended that we give more information in our treasurer's reports. The following is as of September 30, 2018.

The ELCA has stated that contractually all ELCA pastors will take part in this continuing education format each year. Pastor Stacy looks forward to what is presented for next year.

Trustees: Jake Deehr reported that all concrete work was completed this past weekend. He had volunteer friends who donated their time to help Jake with this project. We thank Jake and his friends who helped make this project a reality. A ridge vent has blown off the roof of the church and Jake will be contacting Tusing about replacement. The painting is also entirely done. The painters did a very professional job and everyone is pleased with the results. The Property Team will be having a meeting on November 13, 2018 to determine what other projects need to be done. The Finance Team has recommended that the Property Team use their judgement as to whether we repair the present kitchen door, or repair it and add an electronic keypad for entrance.

FLAMe: Nothing to report.

Endowment Committee: The third quarter endowment report and minutes to the committee's last meeting were reviewed by the Finance Team and reported to Council.

Finance Team: Written report submitted. Recommendations are mentioned under appropriate categories in these minutes.

Faith/Life Team: Written report submitted Paula reported Trunk or Treat went very well and will probably be held inside from now on. Flags will be placed at OVH this Thursday. The Giving Tree will be utilized again this Christmas season and items will be donated to area nursing homes. Paula will be gone from 11/30-12/20 and Lynn Call has agreed to take over Faith/ Life business during that time. The team has welcomed new members Dawn Schlessman and Joleen Dillender.

OLD BUSINESS:

Paula Hoffman moved and Barry Laird seconded that we endorse Allison Young as the head of the soon to be created Church Safety Committee. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote with one abstention.

Sunday School people have begun to have their background checks processed. This can be done online. Council is asking anyone involved with children of St. John's, in any capacity, is to have their background form filled out and sent in. This would include any mentors and also those who take youngsters to visit shut-ins.

The Scholarship proposal was tabled until the next Council meeting.

Finance Team reported that Jim Moore has purchased a new Lavalier microphone, recorder and transmitter for use at the altar. We thank Jim for his work on this and his keeping the cost to just \$130. Barry Laird has volunteered to take Jim's place when Jim is unable to attend a church service. Jim will show Barry how to operate the equipment.

Nominations for next year's Congregational Council members will be announced at the Dec. 4th Council meeting. Many thanks to the committee for their work in preparing a slate of officers and Council members.

Pastor, Church Administrator, organist and custodial evaluations for 2018 have been completed, signed and filed.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Finance Team presented the 2019 Budget. They have increased Pastor Stacy's salary by the ELCA minimum requirement for 2019. Pastor's health insurance will remain at its current level. After discussion Peg Kingsley moved and Bonny Ambos seconded that we approve the budget as presented. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote. Many thanks to Colleen Shupe for her work in preparing this budget for 2019.

The prayer groups have worked really well this past year and as an outcome it has been suggested that we have more prayer requests listed in the bulletin and newsletter each month. The next prayer request is for the formation of the Church Safety Team.

Ann Voight reminded all Council members that Dec. 15th is the deadline for filing for grant requests from the Endowment Fund.

Council decided that the kitchen door should be locked during church services. The front door will remain unlocked and ushers will watch for anyone coming in during a church service. This will be further explored by the Safety Team when it becomes operational.

Ann Voight asked that all team reports for the annual meeting should be turned in no later than January 10th to Sandy Thompson.

The Oversight Committee met on October 27th and found the treasurer's records to be in good order. They have submitted their findings for the annual report and have asked to meet again in early 2019 to review the fourth quarter records for 2018.
