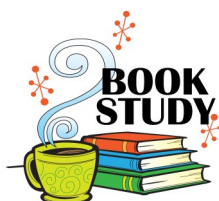

A Message from Bishop Daniel G. Beaudoin

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Psalm 119:105)



I am excited to share with you that **2019** will be the **Year of Scripture** in the Northwestern Ohio Synod.

What follows is a quick outline of Coming Attractions.

The Year of Scripture will have a **3-fold focus**:

Bible Reading as a daily discipline and habit

Bible Reflection to help us become fluent in the language of sacred scripture

Bible Study: to lead us to discover the depths of who God is and the breadth of what God does.

Our Year of Scripture **Memory Verse** is Psalm 119:105 *"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path"*. I encourage you to start committing this Bible verse to memory right away.

A Year of Scripture **Bible Study** will be available on the Synod Website on **January 1, 2019**. This year's 6-session study will focus on the **Sermon on the Mount** from Matthew 5-7. Learn how Jesus reads and reflects on Scripture. Hear Jesus' call that as disciples we are to be hearers **and** doers of God's Word. This 6-session **Sermon on the Mount** Bible study will make a great Lenten Study / Sermon Series.

Our Year of Scripture **Book of the Year** is **A Compact Guide to the Whole Bible: Learning to Read Scripture's Story**. 2015. Edited by Robert W. Wall and David R. Neinhuis (Baker Academic Publishing). This very accessible book takes the reader through the entire narrative of God's Word, with an emphasis on the "metanarrative" of the Biblical story. This small guide will be a great companion during the Year of Scripture, and a great resource for pastors, deacons, and lay leaders.

Synod Wide **Read through the Bible in One Year**. I want to encourage and challenge you to join with the rest of the Northwestern Ohio Synod and read through the entire **Bible in One Year**. Back in 2004 and 2012, the parishes I was serving read through the Bible in One Year as a **community** spiritual practice. Scripture is meant to be read in community, so please don't do this alone.

Between now and December 31, 2018, I want to invite you to form a number of small groups in your parish, who will gather weekly, 2x a month, or monthly (it's really up to you), and commit to doing this spiritual practice **together**. If you do it alone, you're going to get halfway into Leviticus, give up, and get mad at me. Don't do that. Read together. Reflect together. Learn together. It is the best way. And I promise that when you do this together, it will change the conversation and the culture of your parish.

During my weekly e-mails, I will be offering teachings and tips that focus on the **Daily Bible Reading Schedule**. I plan to join you in 2019 as we **Read through the Bible in One Year**.

I look forward to reading, reflecting, studying, and walking with you through **2019, the Year of Scripture**. Bless you,

MINUTES: November Council minutes were approved as written on motion by Barry Laird and seconded by Ann Voight. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Kevin Young moved and Barry Laird seconded that we approve the treasurer's report as given. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Pastor Stacy: Written report submitted. Pastor Stacy reported that she was appointed by the bishop to serve on the Candidacy Team and spent 2 days in Columbus interviewing seminary students. She also was elected at the synod assembly to work on a Consultation Team to work with a congregation in conflict. Both experiences have been very rewarding for her.

Deacons: Nothing new to report.

Elders: Nothing new to report.

Trustees: Jeff Justi checked with our church insurance to upgrade where necessary, as was approved by Council at a previous meeting. The cost for the revisions will be about \$1000. The sidewalks are beautiful and free of standing water! The paint work looks good and the roof has been repaired.

Worship Team: Nothing to report

Good news Amen: Will be restarting in January

FLAMe: Steve Lippert will be president in 2019. The group met with the two new pastors in our area.

Endowment Committee: John Miller reported that recently his committee moved a lot of the money into more secure areas because of the volatile market conditions this year. There have been no applications submitted yet for endowment grants. John asked that Council encourage people to apply. His committee will be meeting on Dec. 20th.

Pastor Stacy reported that she has several grant applications that she will be submitting. Ann Voight moved that Council apply for a \$2200 grant request supporting an honorarium for a Capital Seminary student to come to St. John's to preach in 2019. The grant request would also cover \$1000 donation to Capital Seminary. Colleen Shupe seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

Finance Team: Team did not meet in November.

Faith/Life Team: Written report submitted

OLD BUSINESS:

Allison Young is in the process of forming a Church Safety Team.

Trustees have decided that the back door will be repaired and a digital entry system will be installed on the door.

Sunday School people have begun to have their background checks processed. This can be done online. Council is asking anyone involved with children of St. John's, in any capacity, is to have their background form filled out and sent in. This would include any mentors and also those who take youngsters to visit shut-ins.

DRAFT revisions to the Scholarship Guidelines and Application Form, as discussed by members at the November council meeting, were presented. Council members discussed and accepted both. Bob Krawetzki will give the drafts to Linda Miller-Moore for the Scholarship Committee's review and suggestions. Bob will encourage the committee to submit an application for a grant from the endowment fund for 2019.

Ann Voight went over the sheet that the nomination team has prepared describing the title changes being suggested for council members for 2019. Peg Kingsley moved and Bonny Ambros seconded that we inform the congregation at the annual meeting that said changes are to be made for one year only and that we need congregation approval to make these temporary changes. If the new process works effectively for 2019, Council will ask the congregation at next year's annual meeting to vote to change our Constitution to accommodate the different titles of Council positions. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ann Voight asked that all team reports for the annual meeting should be turned in no later than January 10th to Sandy Thompson.

Council members will have a retreat held on February 2nd from 9AM-2 PM at the Coupling. More information is forthcoming.

Ann also reminded Council members of the website address she has sent for the NWOS. Good reports and messages can be found there monthly.

Bob Krawetzki reminded all team leaders to submit their calendar of descriptions of their team's work throughout the year.

Colleen moved and Ann seconded that we adjourn the meeting. We adjourned by saying the Lord's Prayer.
