

Oct. 31, 2017, will mark the 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation, which is an opportunity for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) to bear witness to the hope and joy we have through Jesus Christ. Many people will be asking about the significance of what happened 500 years ago when Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses. This action started a dialogue that changed the way we receive and share the gospel which continues today. This anniversary is an opportunity to communicate the Lutheran Reformation's significance for faith and life in the 21st Century and the freedom we have in Christ that liberates us to joyfully serve our neighbors.

Leading up to 2017, all ELCA members are encouraged to plan and participate in activities that prepare for this milestone anniversary. These activities will allow us to give thanks for the word's power to free, renew and unite all creation in Christ. At the same time it will provide an opportunity to emphasize the continuing work of reconciliation in the Christian church with our ecumenical partners.
